



- •ME and coroners' offices recording of unidentified remains







The National Missing and Unidentified Persons System (NamUs) is a clearinghouse for missing persons and unidentified decedent records. NamUs is a free online system that can be searched by medical examiners, coroners, law enforcement officials and the general public to solve these cases.

The Unidentified Persons Database contains information entered by medical examiners and coroners.
Unidentified persons are people who



The **Missing Persons Database** contains information about missing persons that can be entered by anyone; before it appears as a case on NamUs, the information is verified. NamUs provides the ability to print missing persons posters and even map out possible travel routes in a search for a missing person. Other resources include links to state clearinghouses, medical examiner and coroner offices, law enforcement agencies, victim assistance groups and pertinent legislation.

When a new missing persons or unidentified decedent case is entered into NamUs, the system automatically performs cross-matching comparisons between the databases, searching for matches or similarities between cases.

NamUs also provides free DNA testing and other forensic services, such as anthropology and odontology assistance.


Working Together


Free Services for state and local agencies



- DNA Family Reference Sample Collection Kits
 - University of North Texas (UNT)
 - Order kits while entering a case on NamUs with a click of a button!
- Forensic Odontologists on staff to code dental images and records
 - Code, digitalize and enter the dental records for missing persons
 - No cost secure courier service for use to transport dental records
- Fingerprint Examination
 - Assist in comparisons
- Cross Matching Feature
 - Simultaneous searching of the Missing Persons cases against Unidentified Persons
 - The general public and public users will not see the possible matches
- Case Tracking feature for ME/C cases on Unidentified Persons system
 - Allows system to send automated emails when a case is modified

 - Note: The NamUs Missing Persons training site was used to produce the video modules. The missing person featured in the videos is not an actual missing person case.
- The training was designed for Law Enforcement users of NamUs Missing persons and were recorded using a full view permission level of the system.
 - Full view permission rights are reserved for sworn Law Enforcement officers, Case
 Managers, Medical field personnel and the Regional System Administrators
 - Each new user requesting a higher permission level is subject to the NamUs validation process
- The interactive training modules allow Law Enforcement to learn about NamUs Missing persons at their leisure.
 - The modules educate Law enforcement on the free forensic services NamUs offers to their agencies once their cases are entered into the system

Welcome to Namus Unidentified Persons

Welcome to the National Unidentified Persons System, a searchable database created to assist in solving cases that involve unidentified human remains. The system includes cases from throughout the United States and may be searched by demographics, physical characteristics, case numbers or other specific information. New records are added every day by medical examiners and coroners across the country, increasing the chances that these unidentified persons will be named. Registration is not necessary to search the database, but coroners and medical examiners are required to register in order to enter case information.

This site is part of NamUs, the National Missing and Unidentified Persons System. This database is designed to search for matches against the Missing Persons System.


State Case Breakdown

Proposing an "exclusion" requires additional information, which will be reviewed by the case manager for follow-up and "approval" or "denial."

Once details of the "exclusion" are added the "Add to Exclusions" button is clicked and - once approved - this UID case will added to the exclusions for this MP case and excluded from future searches (involving this MP case).





Body Identified: January 11, 2010



- •July 2007 Luis Fernandez went missing in Omaha, NE
- •Family reported him missing in June 2008
- •Case was entered into NamUs in March 2009 after Officer Jim Shields of the Omaha Police Department learned about NamUs at a conference at the <u>University</u> of North Texas Center for Human Identification



- •April 6, 2009 a civilian from Iowa contacted Officer Shields and alerted him of a possible match between Luis Fernandez MP #1768 and UP #1870
- •The ME in Ringgold County, Iowa was pulled into the case and began comparing dental records, which were ultimately inconclusive
- •DNA family reference samples were taken from Fernandez's family members and on January 11, 2010 the UP in Iowa was positively identified as Luis Fernandez


Body Identified: June 19, 2009



- •April 20, 2009 Jody King went missing in Enfield, CT after the vehicle he owned (and was believed to be driving) had been in a motor vehicle accident
- •Family reported him missing on April 21, 2009 to local police in NY (Jody's home town)
- •Case was entered into NamUs in May 5, 2009 by his family



- Body was found June 18, 2009 by a security guard on private property near the accident site in a maze of pipes in a culvert
- Autopsy conducted June 19, 2009 in CT
 - OCME CT reached out to NamUs Odontologist for dental records
 - NamUs Odontologist emailed Jody's dental records to the CT OCME, plus a link to Jody's file on NamUs so they could view the images of Jody's tattoos and wedding band if they felt those images would be helpful
- CT OCME had notified Odontologist that they had positively identified the body as that of Jody King using the NamUs dental records.
 - Body Identified within 2 ½ hours from the time Odontologist sent records to OCME



- Identity restored








What was Accomplished?
